IT IS THE MUSEUM'S DESIRE TO CONTINUE TO COLLECT ALONG THIS LINE, AND WITHIN THE PAST SIX YEARS THE MUSEUM HAS DEVELOPED COLLECTIONS IN DEPTH OF THE WORK OF OTHER NOTEWORTHY ARTISTS SUCH AS ESTEBAN VICENTE AND ALAN SHIELDS. THE GOAL OF THIS STRATEGY IS TO ALLOW THE MUSEUM PERIODICALLY TO PRESENT FOCUSED INSTALLATIONS OF SELECT ARTISTS TO FOMENT DEEPER UNDERSTANDING AND APPRECIATION OF THOSE WHO HAVE MADE SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTIONS TO AMERICAN ART HISTORY AND WHO HAVE CLOSE TIES TO THE REGION. THIS DIRECTION IN COLLECTING SETS THE PARRISH APART FROM SISTER INSTITUTIONS THAT TAKE A MORE ENCYCLOPEDIA APPROACH THUS FURTHER CEMENTING THE MUSEUM'S SPECIAL NICHE WITHIN THE OVERALL LANDSCAPE OF MUSEUMS NATIONWIDE. SINCE 2012 THE MUSEUM HAS ADDED 484 WORKS TO THE PERMANENT COLLECTION AND MADE GREAT

HEADWAY IN REALIZING THIS GOAL. THE PERMANENT COLLECTION FORMS THE FOUNDATION FOR THE MUSEUM'S OVERALL EFFORTS.
