May 25-December 8, 2024

Carmen Herrera: Estructuras Monumentales features four large-scale sculptures in the Museum's South Meadow. The four works, Angulo Azul (2017), Angulo Amarillo (2017), Estructura Verde (1966/2018), and Gemini (Red) (1971/2019) are part of Herrera's series Estructuras, which she initially envisioned as sketches and paintings in the 1960s.



FRESH PAINT: Lauren Halsey

June 8-August 25, 2024

FRESH PAINT is a new quarterly single-artwork exhibition in collaboration with The FLAG Art Foundation. Launching with a mixed media piece, pride n progress thang (2024), by Lauren Halsey, the series presents the most exciting emerging and established artists working today. FRESH PAINT is responsive to current cultural events and fosters a timely dialogue with our communities. Each new artwork is accompanied by two sets of interpretative texts: one by an author, critic, poet, or scholar, and another by members of the Parrish Teen Council ARTscope. One text for Halsey's work is by Robeson Taj P. Frazier, assistant professor in the School of Communication at USC Annenberg.





Rafael Lozano-Hemmer: Collider

October 13, 2024-November 2, 2025

The Parrish will present *Collider*, a new public artwork by Rafael Lozano-Hemmer, as part of the annual façade installation series. Made up of hundreds of small LED spotlights that create a calm, rippling curtain of light along the Museum's south wall, *Collider* will be visible from Montauk Highway and react in real time to cosmic radiation originating from stars and black holes.

Eddie Martinez: Buflies

June 30-September 29, 2024

Celebrated for his bright, bold, and colorful paintings, Eddie Martinez will present a new body of work made specifically for the Parrish. Taking full advantage of the Museum's expansive space and high ceilings, Martinez is creating seven 12-foot tall *Bufly* paintings. Like much of his work, these canvases are imbued with a personal iconography. The artist started the *Bufly* series in 2021 when his two-year old son Arthur became fascinated with butterflies, mispronouncing them as "buflies." Martinez represents San Marino at this year's Venice Biennale.


Sam Moyer: Ferns Teeth

June 30-September 29, 2024

Sam Moyer's exhibition will showcase the artist's relationship to material and light as a throughline in her practice, displaying the range of her processes, and bodies of work, across three galleries. Focusing each space on a specific material relationship, Moyer presents us with a large-scale stone painting tailor-fit to the architecture of the room, a free-standing sculpture from her *Dependent* series, sculptural photographs whose compositions are specific to the landscape of Eastern Long Island, and a series of smaller, more representational wall works.

Julia Chiang: The Glows and The Blows

July 14-October 13, 2024

For her first solo museum exhibition, painter and sculptor Julia Chiang will create new, large-scale paintings and ceramics. Chiang operates in the realm of abstractions, but the body is the basis for her allegories, metaphors, and explorations. The organic-looking imagery in fresh vibrant hues borrows from the physical—medical scans, internal body liquids and environments—and the psychological—fields of layered feelings and emotions, tensions between internal turmoil and external pressures, between fragility and strength.

2024 Parrish Road Show | Andrea Cote: To Belong to the World



September 14-October 14, 2024

For the 2024 Parrish Road Show, the Museum has invited Andrea Cote to create a site-specific exhibition at Bridge Gardens in Bridgehampton. Now in its thirteenth year, Parrish Road Show is the Museum's off-site project designed to encourage engagement and interaction between artists and the communities beyond the Museum's walls. To Belong to the World will be an outdoor installation composed of uniquely printed fabric and bamboo structures that complement and highlight the Garden's landscape. The work continues Cote's exploration of her connection with the environment through daily exposed cyanotypes reflecting the sun, cosmos, and body.

October 13, 2024-April 6, 2025

A New Subjectivity 1979/2024 looks back at the exhibition Nouvelle Subjectivité, organized by Jean Clair at the Palais des Beaux Arts in Brussels in 1979. The exhibition at the Parrish pays tribute to the original exhibition by presenting works from several artists included then—Robert Guinan, David Hockney, and Philippe Roman, among others—as well as works by artists whose work has continued the figurative traditions such as Jordan Casteel, Jim Dine, Peter Doig, Rackstraw Downes, Jane Freilicher, Jenna Gribbon, Flora Natapoff, and Arcmanoro Niles.

October 13, 2024-April 6, 2025

The career-spanning exhibition blends Audrey Flack's iconic photorealist painting techniques with her early background in Abstract Expressionism and newest "Post-Pop Baroque" series. Ranging from paintings and drawings to prints and sculptures, the exhibition will include new and recent works as well as works from the 1940s and 1950s.

Beyond Reality: Paintings and Drawings by Bertrand Meniel

October 13, 2024-April 6, 2025

This survey includes paintings and drawings by French photorealist Bertrand Meniel who since 1996 has created paintings of unprecedented detail. Using a variety of photographs of his chosen subject and advanced digital technologies, Meniel perfects each image by combing through hundreds of shots on a computer screen before painting them onto canvas.

Charlotte Park: The Life of Forms in Color

October 27, 2024-March 2, 2025

Charlotte Park: The Life of Forms in Color is a comprehensive survey of considerable scope comprising almost 100 paintings and works on paper, mostly drawn from the 2017 gift of works to the Museum by the James and Charlotte Brooks Foundation. Color and form, often related to the living environment that surrounded the studio Park shared with her husband James Brooks, were strong and constant forces in her work.

Ralph Gibson: Theorem

October 27, 2024-March 2, 2025

Ralph Gibson will present a selection of photographs from a series based on the relationship between shapes found in nature and human constructs; positing that nature is visually evident in all genres of industrial design and architecture is evoked in the relationship between forms and ergonomic function. In this exhibition, Gibson highlights the relationship between perspective, color, and proportion. The 35mm Leica format and optical glass are an essential component of the work, and the dimensions of the frame are based on the ancient Greek "Golden Means."

Among notable additions to our collection this year is *Hurricane* by Peter Nadin (American, b. Britain, 1954), who moved to New York in 1976 and became a pivotal figure in the downtown art scene. Nadin created the oil on paper piece in 1985 in Wainscott on the East End during Hurricane Gloria, depicting the perceptual transformation he experienced through his barricaded window moments before the storm destroyed his studio. The work is a generous gift by Diane L. Ackerman, and marks Nadin's inaugural representation in the Parrish collection.


