

# PARRISH ART MUSEUM

Dear Friend.

As 2025 draws to a close, I want to thank you for supporting the Parrish Art Museum. This year, we welcomed 41,000 visitors, including 10,000 participants in our education programs, and served 1,500 individuals through ACCESS PARRISH, our initiative for people with physical and mental disabilities. The contributions from our members, donors, and the local tax levy make everything we do possible. Because of you, the Parrish remains a vibrant home for art, learning, engagement, and creativity.

With your help, we presented acclaimed exhibitions by East End artists including Audrey Flack, Ralph Gibson, James Howell, Charlotte Park, and Nina Yankowitz, alongside international figures such as Sean Scully, Hiroshi Sugimoto, Shirin Neshat, Bertrand Meniel, and Rafael Lozano-Hemmer. We continued our FRESH PAINT series and deepened our partnership with The FLAG Art Foundation. We also celebrated over 1,000 student artists from 52 schools in our beloved annual Student Exhibition, a 72-year tradition and one of our most joyful and deeply rooted community celebrations.

Looking ahead, 2026 marks the nation's 250<sup>th</sup> birthday and a milestone year for the Parrish. Our year-long series, *Life, Liberty, and The Pursuit of Happiness*, will explore how art reflects these ideals through major exhibitions on **ecological art** and **Abstract Expressionism** as well as contemporary exhibitions by **Sanford Biggers and Tony Bechara**. We will also celebrate **William Merritt Chase and Walter Granville-Smith**, early impressionists on the East End.

We know that music programming is meaningful to our audiences, and I am happy to share that the Parrish will present live music throughout 2026, including jazz on select Fridays during the summer.

The Parrish is for everyone, for students discovering art for the first time, for artists shaping our culture, for ACCESS PARRISH participants engaging through inclusive programs, and for community members like you, who make it all possible.
